- Goal: choose the right tool, write effective prompts, and produce decks faster

Why No-Code AI Changes Presentation Work

BEFORE: MANUAL & MESSY



AFTER: AI-GENERATED & POLISHED



- Blank-slide syndrome, manual layout, inconsistent formatting, slow image sourcing



- AI generates first drafts fast: visual hierarchy, layouts, and template consistency



- Usable draft in under a minute instead of hours



- Human judgment stays in charge: accuracy, audience, and final message



- Presenter decides what to keep, rewrite, or discard

Workflow for Trainers and Educators



Workflow for Business Teams



- Turn meeting notes, reports, and documents into polished decks



- Apply company templates, tone, and brand rules from the start



- Use shared workspaces, comments, and fast revision cycles



- Repurpose decks into updates, pitches, summaries, or one-pagers



- Prefer native add-ons when files must stay in PowerPoint or Slides

- - Web-native drafters: Gamma, beautiful decks in seconds
- - All-in-one design: Canva, flexible editor and asset library
- - Automatic brand layouts: Beautiful.ai
- - Native add-ons: Plus AI, SlidesAI for Slides and PowerPoint
- - Copilot for Microsoft 365 teams
- - Decide by: speed, brand control, export fidelity, and price



Quick picks: draft fastest with Gamma, design broadly with Canva, enforce brand with Beautiful.ai, stay native with Plus AI, SlidesAI, or Copilot

Writing Effective Slide Prompts



- Specify audience, purpose, tone, and structure in each prompt



- Include source material: outlines, notes, or existing documents



- Prompt iteratively: start rough, review, refine slide by slide



- Avoid vague topics, missing context, and accepting first drafts unchanged



- Example: "Audience: new hires. Goal: onboarding overview. 8 slides. Tone: friendly."

Avoiding Generic Outputs and Branding Issues



- > - Watch for repetitive layouts and templated phrasing



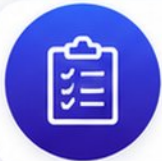
- > - Apply brand kits and themes early to prevent style drift



- > - Use tools with auto-layout to prevent text overflow



- > - Verify statistics and claims; AI can produce false facts



- > - Run a final checklist for visual and factual consistency



Accessibility and Readability Checkpoints



- Check contrast, font size, and text density before presenting



- Avoid text over busy backgrounds; establish clear visual hierarchy



- Use readable bullets over dense paragraphs on slides



- Test deck at projection distance or actual screen size



- Small fixes after generation boost comprehension for all viewers



Export and File Quality Considerations



- Web-native tools can break when exported to PPTX



- Native add-ons like Plus AI, SlidesAI, or Copilot avoid conversion risks



- Always test one export before committing to a tool



- Check fonts, layouts, gradients, and image quality after export



- Choose export based on your final deliverable

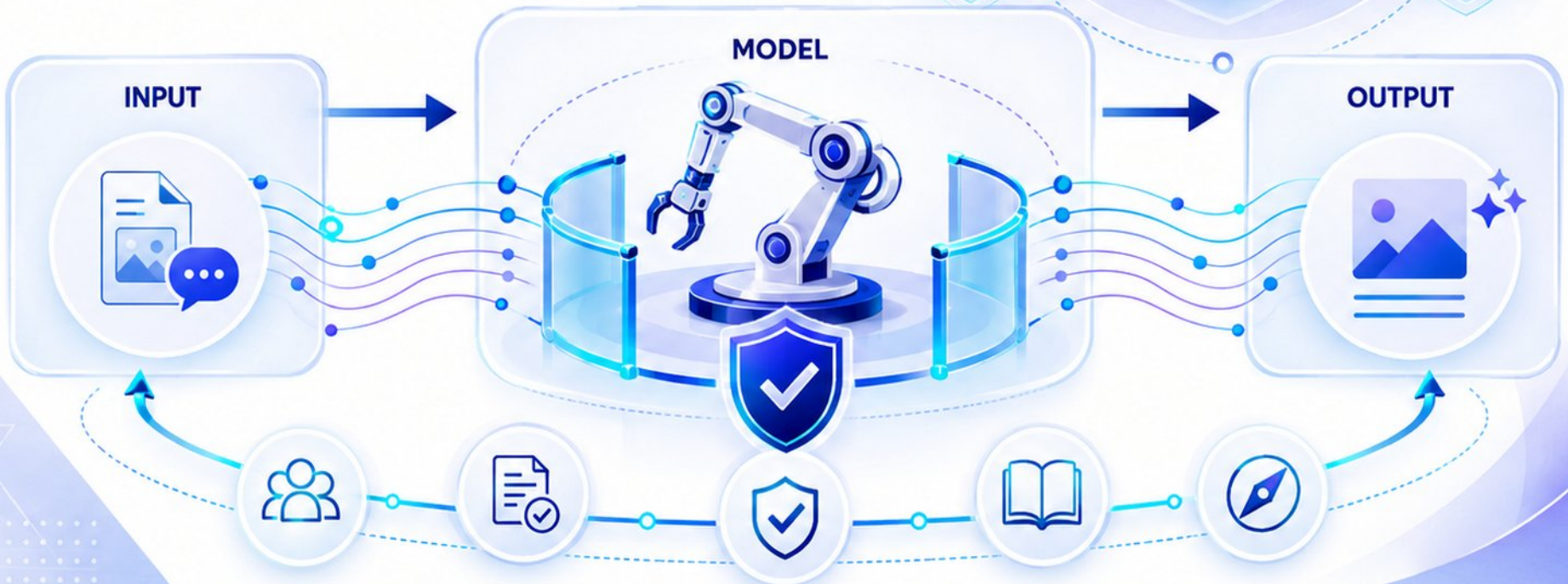

Ethics, Privacy, and Data Handling

- - Verify what happens to your prompts, uploads, and generated content
- - Avoid submitting confidential data without verified enterprise protections
- - Check policies: many tools guarantee no training on your user data
- - Review licensing for AI-generated images and template assets
- - Follow your organization's policies on AI use and disclosure



Practical Exercise: Build a Three-Slide Draft



- Start from a short outline or bulleted notes



- Prompt with audience, purpose, and desired structure



- Review the generated outline before slides are built



- Check clarity, brand fit, and factual accuracy



- Export in the format your real workflow requires



Review and Quality Checklist



- Confirm deck matches audience, purpose, and time limit

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- Verify statistics, names, acronyms, and factual claims

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- Ensure fonts, colors, logos, and spacing match brand kit

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- Verify contrast, font size, and layout for readability

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- Replace generic or templated phrasing with targeted content

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Next Steps and Continued Learning

- - Test one fast web tool and one native add-in side by side
- - Build a reusable prompt library for recurring deck types
- - Follow tool updates, pricing changes, and new AI features
- - Explore community templates and examples for your field
- - Track results: faster drafts, brand consistency, audience response

less production time, sharper decks, better outcomes.

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
