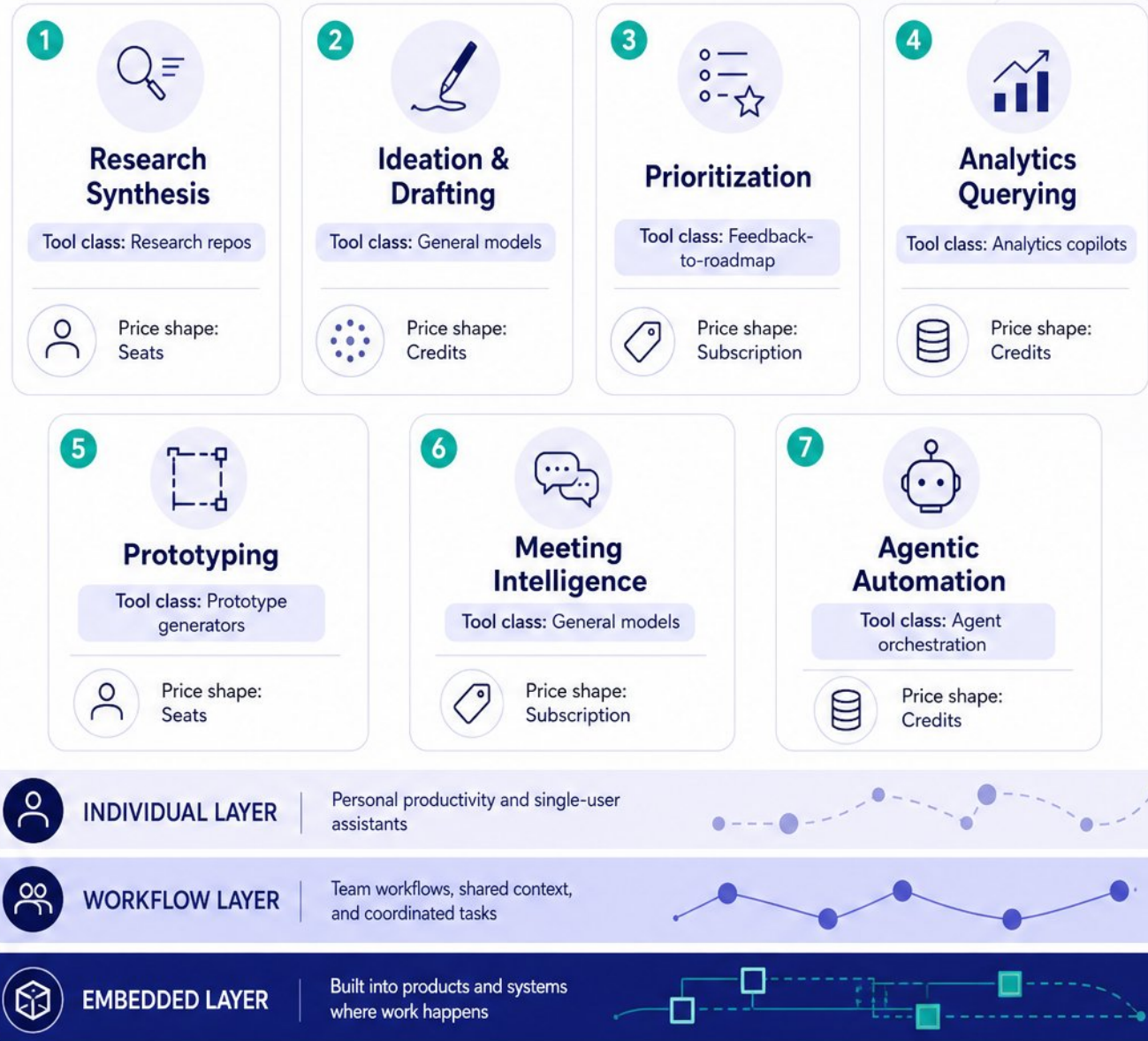


Product Management AI Tools: Selection and Workflow Design

- > - 73% of PMs use AI weekly or daily; 61% of job postings now require AI experience
- > - 97% report personal productivity gains, but only 64% see improved product outcomes
- > - Just 23% of organizations have a clear AI strategy with defined ownership
- > - Three layers: individual productivity tools, product-workflow tools, embedded product features
- > - Design against tool sprawl, unclear ownership, metric-free adoption, compliance blind spots
- > - Roadmap: evaluation, workflow patterns, handoffs, governance, measurement, 30-60-90 plan

The 2026 AI Landscape for Product Teams

- Seven capability families: research, drafting, prioritization, analytics, prototyping, meetings, agentic automation
- Match tool class to job: general models, feedback-to-roadmap, research repos, analytics copilots, prototype generators
- Most PMs run three or four tools, one per phase; median team now uses 4.2 tools, down from 5.8
- Buying criteria shifts with model layer: long context, multimodal input, reliable tool use, agent orchestration
- Prompt, subscription, internal build, or embedded feature — plus pricing shape: seats, credits, TCO



Requirements Before Tools: Map the Workflow First



- Start from the workflow, not the vendor demo



- Decompose each workflow into tasks: automate, augment, or human-only



- Separate high-frequency, low-judgment work from high-judgment calls



- Set data-sensitivity tiers: public, internal, confidential, regulated

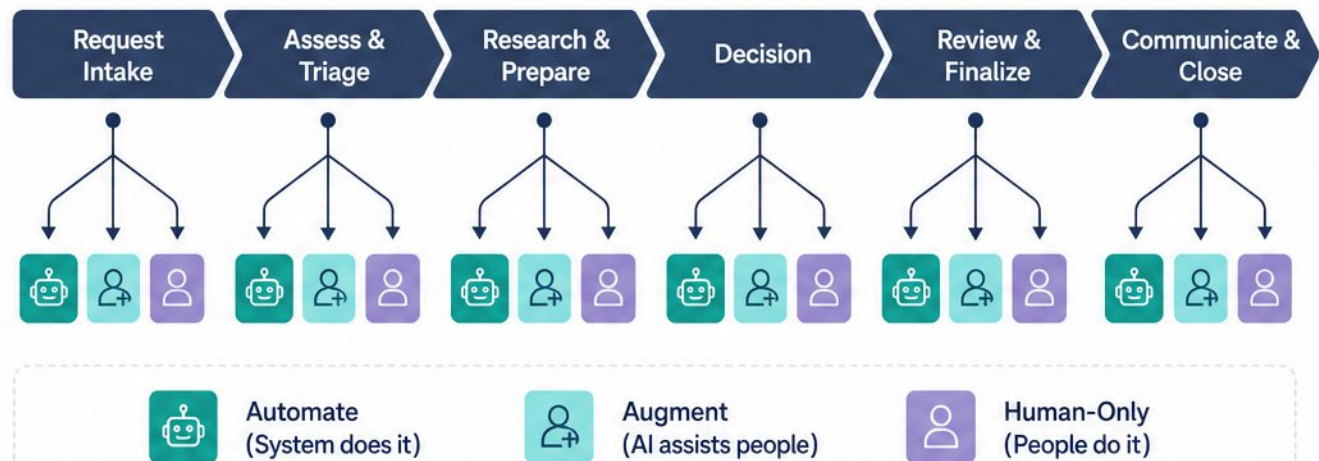


- Capture four baselines: cycle time, labor cost, error rate, rework rate

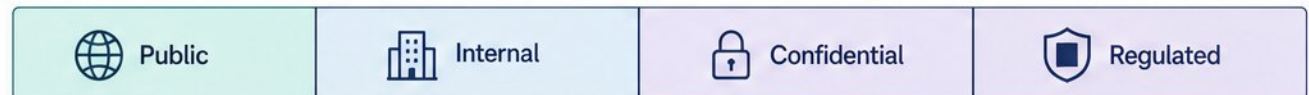


- **Output:** a one-page workflow map anchoring every tool decision

DATA-SENSITIVITY TIERS (APPLY TO EACH TASK)

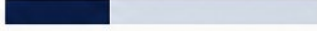
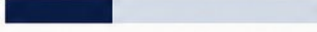
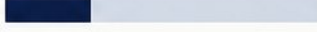


FOUR BASELINES TO CAPTURE



Evaluation Framework: Score Tools Against Real Work

- Set the shortlist threshold before scoring begins
- Go/no-go gates disqualify regardless of weighted score
- Run task-based pilots in a buyer-controlled environment
- Model full cost of ownership, not headline price
- Write advance decision rules for advancing or rejecting

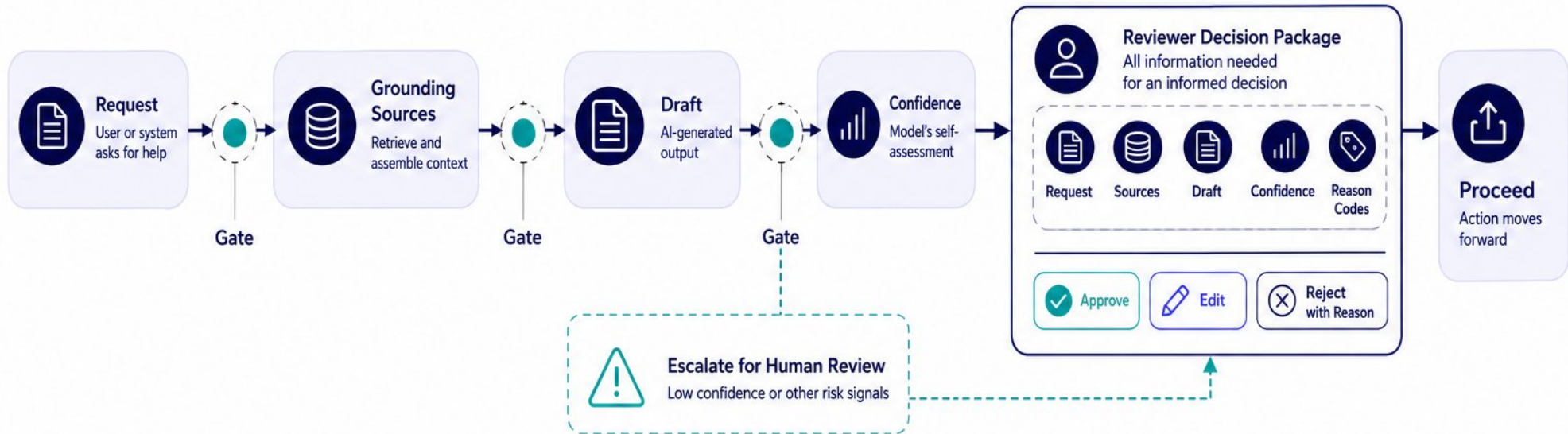

Designing the Human-AI Handoff



- Gate irreversible, external, or regulated actions; skip gates on drafts and reversible artifacts
- Well-calibrated systems route under 10% of actions to human review
- Over-gating breeds rubber-stamping; under-gating ships incidents
- Reviewers need decision packages: request, sources, draft, confidence, reason codes
- Version prompts, log decisions with reviewer identity, and retain source sets
- On timeout, deny by default — never auto-approve

Governance, Risk, and Compliance for AI-Enabled Product Work

- ✓ - Classify use case first: decisioning, generation, retrieval, or automation
- ✓ - Get data handling in writing: training use, retention, residency, subprocessors
- ✓ - Request SOC 2 Type II, ISO 27001, and ISO 42001 where available
- ✓ - Pin model versions; secure advance notice, sandbox testing, deprecation terms
- ✓ - Article 50 disclosure applies now; high-risk duties deferred to Dec 2027
- ✓ - Name an owner per AI system; maintain reviewed inventory and use policy

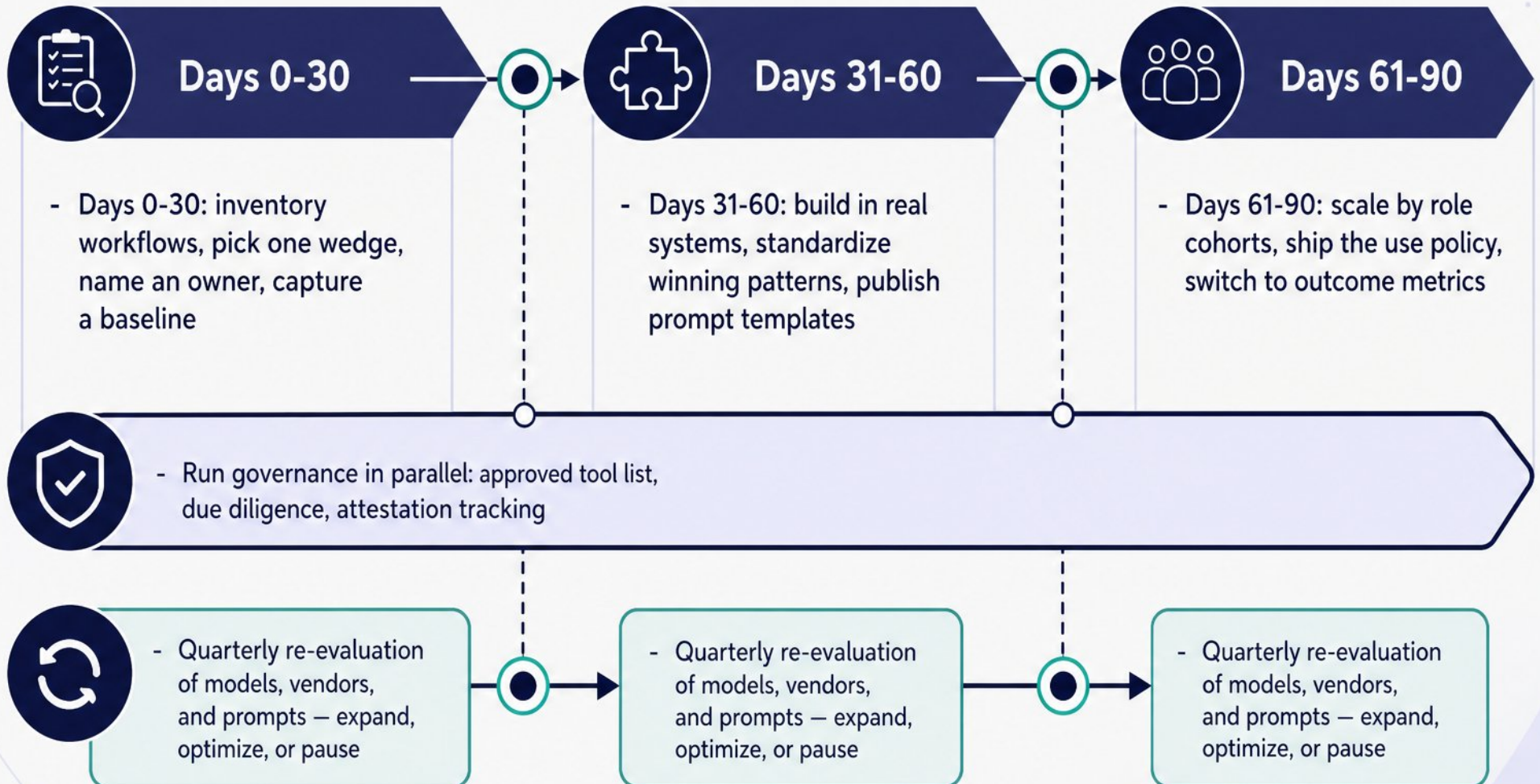


Time-in-tool



- Adoption and usage data show deployment coverage, never delivered value
- Leading indicators: time-to-artifact, first-pass yield, rework rate, review burden
- Lagging indicators: decision quality, launch outcomes, customer-facing results
- Tokens, prompts, and time-in-tool are gameable activity, not productivity
- Monthly ops scorecard: one outcome plus one compounding metric per workflow

Build the Plan: 30-60-90 Day AI Workflow Adoption



Workshop: Score a Tool and Draft One Workflow

- **Exercise 1:** apply the weighted scorecard plus independent go/no-go gates
- **Exercise 2:** design one workflow — trigger, AI step, gate, artifact, owner
- **Exercise 3:** write one outcome metric, one compounding metric, rework signal
- **Peer review:** use the governance checklist as critique rubric
- **Capture** decisions, open questions, owners on a one-page template
- **Commit:** one 30-day pilot with baseline and success threshold written first
